Directions: You are to create and illustrate a comic strip/poster that demonstrates the following rules of commas. You must write the rule, and you must provide an example as well. Neatness and creativity count, so do your best!

- 1. Use a comma to separate items in a list
- 2. Use a comma to separate two independent clauses connected by and, but, or, nor, or for.
- 3. Use a comma to set off an introductory phrase or clause from the main sentence.
- 4. Use a comma to set off the name of the person you are speaking to.
- 5. Use commas to set off an interrupting phrase.
- 6. Use commas to set off direct quotes.
- 7. Use commas to set off an appositive.
- 8. Use commas to separate the names of cities, states, and countries.
- 9. Use comma when addressing the recipient of an informal letter.
- 10. Use a comma to separate the month and date from the year. When only the month and year are given, do not use a comma.

NOTE: You will need a creative title for your project. Organize your poster and be sure to color it in completely.
